"The Boat clinic plays a crucial role in delivering Health care services to remote communities as well as hard to reach areas. This floating clinic are equipped with essential Medical facilities including Doctors' Room, Laboratories, pharmacies enabling them to provide comprehensive Health care services that are often isolated due to geographical challenge & frequent flood," Dr.Kaman made this remarks into the Visitors Book. Dr. Kaman was accompanied by a team of district officials including the Rashtraiya Bal Swasthya Karyakram (RBSK) Coordinator, Mitrajyoti Konwar, Supervisor of Social Welfare, department Ms Pompi Dutta. "The service offered by Boat Clinic encompasses general Health check ups, immunization, Ante Natal & Post Natal care & Health education, awareness etc.

This initiative has significantly improved access to Health care for thousands of residents in these difficult Islands reducing Maternal & infant mortality rate," wrote Dr. Kaman.

A total of 89 patients participated in the health camp and availed different health care services including 10 ANC check ups. During his visit to the Island, Dr, Kama also visited the schools and Anganwadi Kendras there and interacted with the local people.



Naitonal Defence College Team visits Boat Clinic

A team of officials from the National Defence College (NDC), New Delhi, visited the Boat Clinic at Dibrugarh on February 6, 2025. The Boat Clinic Unit received the 17-member NDC team from Bindhakata Ghat in Chabua and was taken on Akha Boat Clinic for about 2 hours to reach the health camp held at Tengabari Village under Panitola BPHC in Dibrugarh. The members of the NDC team observed the Boat Clinic program closely including health checkups and immunization drives for better understanding of the process and also to get a glimpse into the lives of the communities.



Sanjoy Hazarika, the C-NES Managing Trustee had earlier briefed the NDC team prior to their visit in New Delhi about how the concept of boat clinics emerged and the first Akha Boat Clinic was started in 2004. NDC team members interacted with the participants of health camp and were informed about the ongoing partmership with the NHM, Government of Assam.

The NDC team was also informed of how the Boat Clinics were upscaled from five districts in 2008 to 15 districts now with 16 units. The Dibrugarh Boat Clinic team also highlighted other details such as the population covered, services provided, monthly camp schedule, transportation facilities during emergencies for pregnant women and about the overall performance of the clinics.
